The Enthronement Service for the 72nd Bishop of Exeter, the Rt. Revd. Dr Mike Harrison, will be next Saturday 2nd November at Exeter Cathedral. The first Bishop was Leofric who, in 1050, moved the seat of the Bishop from Crediton to Exeter, so Bishop Mike will be anointed and enthroned in a service that will be a blend of traditions stretching back a thousand years with more modern touches, such as contributions from local schools and community groups. The wonderful Cathedral choir will be in fine voice. As one of the lay canons, I will be dressed up and processing with a large number of finely clad clergy. In short there will be lots of pomp and ceremony, and some might question the relevance of such things in contemporary secular society. I've two answers to that. First, it is fitting to celebrate God's calling to Bishop Mike and to do so in a way that gives praise to God through the music and liturgy, at the same time lifting the spirits of those present. Secondly, underlying the pomp is the serious business of mission and service, and as an episcopal church the tone and direction of mission is set in part by our Bishop. For months when I lead Sunday services, I have been remembering Bishop Mike in prayer for his task will not be easy. There will be competing demands on his time, as he seeks to be both a pastor and a leader within a large diocese and also a prophetic voice to wider society. So do pray for Bishop Mike.
