Imagine as hard as you can, with all your courage and boldness and naivety that life will one day be just simply the best it could be in every way. Just take a moment now to close your eyes and imagine.

If joy is the goal. And we must remind ourselves it is. How might we plan and host our Christmases differently this year to truly reach for it, rather than simply keeping up appearances?
