Therefore do not worry". Are you a worrier? Most of us are, in one sense or another, though some more than others. I remember once meeting a church pastor, who was originally from Germany. When he first became a Christian as a young man, his parents, disliking anything to do with the Christian faith, threw him out of the house on Christmas Eve. Walking away, he turned into a field and knelt down, giving himself to God, to whom he said "You must now take on the role of parent in my life". He eventually became a pastor here in England. There was a remarkable sense of freedom and trust in his life, stemming from that original experience, allowing along the way for God to provide for his many different needs, seeming to treat material possessions with a light hand.

"Therefore do not worry" says Jesus, "only first do the work I give you for the growth of my kingdom, and all these things I will provide for you in turn". These are comforting words for us for the many different challenges that meet us each day. May God bless you in every aspect of your life.
